

Student requirements (Master's study and PhD study)

Eligibility

- Be enrolled as a master's or PhD student at the sending institution at the time of application and during the mobility
- Have a topic that fits the partnership scope and host expertise
- Have sufficient language ability (English B2) for study/research activities
- Submit a complete application
- The mobility must fit the doctoral research plan. (PhD students only)
- Supervisor approval is mandatory (PhD students only)
- For Master students, successful completion of the agreed host courses will be recognised by the sending institution through ECTS credit transfer in line with the signed Learning Agreement.
- For PhD students, the mobility outcomes (research activities and achieved milestones) will be formally recognised by the sending institution in line with the signed Research Plan/Learning Agreement and recorded in the doctoral progress assessment where applicable.

Required documents (applicants must submit)

- CV
- Motivation letter (max 1 page) – Please make sure to mention the barriers, in case you are facing any in your study, economic or health situation, which need to be addressed by the host institution
- Proposal of mobility activities:
 - Master: study plan + courses linked to the thesis topic.
 - PhD: study plan + courses, research plan with objectives, methods, timeline, and expected outputs.
- Transcript of records (Master) and/or doctoral progress confirmation (PhD), if available
- Supervisor endorsement:
 - Master: supervisor or department coordinator
 - PhD: supervisor
- Proof of language ability or willingness to attend an interview for assessment.

Study and research commitments (mandatory)

Selected students must:

- Sign a Learning Agreement / Research Plan (before departure).
- Participate in specific courses or research training linked to the final thesis/dissertation
 - Master: courses relevant to the thesis topic and recognised in the study plan.

- PhD: advanced courses and/or structured research training relevant to the dissertation.
- Complete the agreed workload and activities at the host:
 - Master: defined courses and required assessments.
 - PhD: defined research milestones and outputs (e.g., experiment plan, dataset, draft section).
- Attend mandatory host academic activities (seminars, lab meetings, colloquia), if required.
- Participate in at least one excursion/site visit/field activity offered by the host, when relevant and feasible.
- Follow host rules (attendance, safety, ethics, academic integrity).

Output and reporting (mandatory)

Selected students must deliver:

- End-of-mobility report (short report, template provided by the coordinator).
- Evidence of completion:
 - Master: transcript or confirmation of completed courses/credits.
 - PhD: signed confirmation of research progress + evidence of outputs (slides, log, draft, etc.).
- Evaluation and feedback report
- Participants' reports in EC Beneficiary Module

Dissemination requirement (staff and students)

- Actively contribute to dissemination during/after the mobility.
- Provide at least one internal output (e.g., seminar/talk for students or department).
- Provide at least three dissemination outputs for different target groups
 - Website news (department/faculty/university level)
 - Newsletter
 - Social media via institutional channels
 - Outreach to industry/public
 - Partner network
- Submit evidence of dissemination (slides/link/text) with the final report.
